Key values & priorities
for Judeo-Christian party



1. Justice

We believe that justice is the basis of Christian policy. It is the fundamental requirement of God to his people which can be seen throughout the Holy Scripture. This means that all people are equal before the law.

4. Preservation of life

6. Respect for the aging in society
