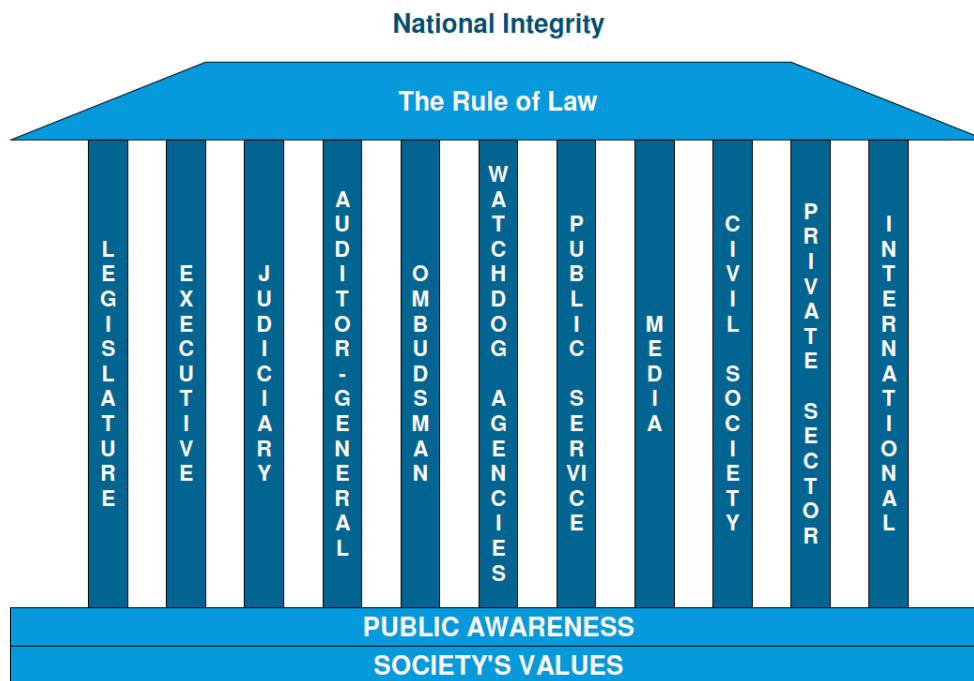


## DEVELOPING A NATIONAL ANTI-CORRUPTION STRATEGY

The group will come together at the beginning for a short outline on the subject of corruption. This will include a brief introduction to the major pillars of the National Integrity System developed by Jeremy Pope at Transparency International (slightly modified).



After this introduction the group will work in its own way, organising itself and its ideas.

1. As group members come from different countries you will need to imagine a fictitious country. You must decide in how much detail to describe this country and its problems with corruption.
2. You can take the National Integrity model as a starting point if you wish, or invent your own. You will need to think deeply about what kinds of initiative, organisations and legislation to include order to give your strategy a good hope of being successful.
3. Do not limit yourselves only to governmental and other official components. Think of what the general public might do, and how this could be encouraged and supported.
4. It will not be possible to cover everything. The group will need to decide which aspects of anticorruption activity should be given priority.
5. It is up to you to decide how to prepare and organise your presentation to the feedback session.
6. I shall be available for consultation, but *not* very closely involved; this is to be *your* strategy.
